Over the past few years, the Churchyard at St Peter's has been getting quite "full"! The field to the West of the Churchyard is owned by the Diocese of Carlisle, and they have offered to gift us a piece of that field as a Churchyard extension. We're currently going through all the legal niceties, including planning permission for change of use (which you may have seen the notice for). This should provide us with enough additional room for a few decades!

We're hoping to come up with a plan to improve the selection of trees, and to set aside some areas for wild-flower planting. We'll be arranging a meeting or two in the Churchyard to look at what we have already, and to talk through ideas of the changes we might make. There are one or two bits of tidying up that we already know need to be done, so we'll be having a working party sometime soon. During a week in June, the "Churches Count on Nature" project investigating nature in churchyards will bring local people together to discover the wildlife in their local church yard, recording the species they find, combining their results with others which will be collated on the National Biodiversity Network (NBN), a nation-wide database of wildlife in the UK.

#### PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

**Interpretative Information Boards** Following the installation last year of an Information Board in the Bus Shelter, two additional boards have now been installed opposite Townhead Farm and Opposite St Peter's Church. These are proving to be very popular with visitors to the village.

Tree Planting on the village greens You will recall a request in the last newsletter and a "call out" on Facebook for your views and there have been a large number of suggestions regarding species, number and location and these suggestions are now being reviewed by Jim Bliss of Lowther Estates in readiness for the winter tree planting season.

**Helton Bridleway** A footbridge on the lower Helton bridleway was washed away last winter and currently discussions are taking place between Lowther Estates and the LDNP to replace the brige and improve the bridleway.

**Car Parking in Askham and Helton** The restrictions on parking by the cattlegid at the top of Askham has increased pressure on parking on Helton fell. Dialogue is currently taking place between the Parish Council, CCC, LDNP and land owners to try to resolve this issue.

## **MOVE IT OR LOSE IT**

Pauline Ireland has been teaching fitness classes in our community for over ten years and has now extended her programme to include classes that are specifically designed for older adults (60yrs upwards).

The aim of the specialist classes is to improve people's Flexibility, Aerobic health, Balance and Strength (FABS for short) gently and steadily. The exercises can be done seated or standing and can be adapted to suit individuals' particular needs".

They are also designed to be fun and delivered in a friendly environment where both men and women can meet to improve their health. They are aimed at people who would find normal gym classes unsuitable or might feel that regular exercise might be beyond them.

The classes will be run on a Monday and Thursday, starting 7<sup>th</sup> June at 10.30am in Askham Community Hall.

Pauline, who is the only specialised 'Move it or Lose it' instructor in Cumbria, adds:

"Behind the fun nature of the class, there is a serious mission to help people stay independent for longer. It's unbelievable to think that 25% of women and 7% of men over 70 don't have sufficient leg strength to get out of a chair without using their arms. When people lose their strength, they also start to lose their independence, so undertaking a suitable exercise programme helps turn back the clock and helps people can keep doing the things they love for longer".

On top of the 'Move it or Lose It' classes, Pauline is also running several other classes that may appeal to variety of needs in the community.
