ASKHAM and HELTON PARISH COUNCIL

A meeting was held in ADCC on Tuesday 29th March 2022 and the following items were discussed:

Signage is to be installed to discourage large vehicles from coming into Askham via the bridge. There has recently been damage to the corner following use by long heavy vehicles

Plans to mark the Platinum Jubilee of Queen Elizabeth II were discussed and these include:

A beacon on Heughscar Hill which will be coordinated by Barton Parish Council

A Tea party on Askham Greens

Refurbishment of the Bus Shelter (which was originally built in 1953 to mark the Queen's Coronation)

It is hoped that as many local people as possible will be involved in the above.

After consultation with residents it was decided to reduce the frequency of mowing the greens in Helton which would benefit wildlife and enable more flowers to grow as well as reducing costs.

The Parish Council has been consulted on our views regarding whether the number of holiday lets and second homes should be subject to planning arrangements.

ASKHAM AND DISTRICT COMMUNITY CENTRE

The Village Hall is now open following a major refurbishment of the main hall and adjoining storerooms. The main hall has improved heating and lighting, new windows and fire doors and the floor has been enhanced with a special coating.

There are 120 new chairs to complete the project. The Trustees have decided to offer the existing stock of chairs to any group who could make good use of them. They were originally a gift to ADCC but for our purposes, they are now past their best. Please contact Mike Slee (01931 712 834) if your group or organisation would like some.

There is a new small meeting room accommodating up to twelve which also doubles up as a bar when special events are taking place. There is also an expanded secure store room.

If you have any information, stories, (and especially photos) from "the early days" we would love to see them as we are hoping to produce a celebratory display.



GETTING FIT FOR GARDENING

You'll be surprised the muscles you use when gardening, all that bending forward, squatting, kneeling. It may be wise to prepare your body. like you prepare your garden to flourish.

A regularly, a stretch and a warm-up before gardening are smart precautions to take; if exercise is not part of your daily routine, these stretches are necessary to safeguard your back. Try the stretches below, hold each stretch for about 15-30 secs

Think about performing different tasks alternately to avoid over-stressing one group of muscles. For example, if you've been on your knees weeding for a half-hour, make your next activity one that allows you to stand. Pruning taller shrubs or tending to hanging baskets will give your leg and back muscles a welcome respite.
